- ◆ 4-H Horse Project members must select whether or not to be considered for the Regional Communications before their presentation. Please indicate on the registration form in the Code column – H-RC for regional consideration <u>OR</u> H-NRC for non-regional.
- ♦ Horse Communications are timed! Presentations are 9-12 minutes long. Three (3) points/minute (or fraction of a minute) will be deducted from your score if you go over or under the allotted time. Practice, Practice, Practice!!



### 4-H Shooting Sports Winter Instructor Workshop February 25th-27th



The 2022 4-H Shooting Sports Winter Instructor Workshop will be held February 25th-27th. This workshop is open to 4-H volunteers. If you are not currently a 4-H volunteer, but would like to become one in order to participate in this training, we can arrange for that as well.

The course will consist of Virtual Positive Youth Development (offered remotely on February 25th) and in-person instruction on February 26-27 at the 4-H Training Center in Ballston Spa. We are limited to 2 participants per discipline this year, so we will have to be selective regarding who is registered, and this does not necessarily mean that it will be "first come first served". Discipline will be given to instructors looking to start a new club in Saratoga county, those who are looking to aid in expanding 4-H Shooting Sports programming in Saratoga County, and those who are currently members of clubs who are looking to expand programming within their club. We hope you understand our need to be selective in registrations. In total, we are only able to send 12 participants from Saratoga County. We are looking at offering a local training for Instructors in the spring for those unable to participate in February.

Disciplines being offered are: Air Pistol, Archery, Hunting, Muzzleloading, Rifle and Shotgun. The cost of the course is \$90 for those not needing lodging, and \$125 for those requiring a hotel room.




#### Ag Literacy Week: Volunteers Needed

### **The Fred Sanders Award for 4-H Youth**



Fred Sanders grew up showing cattle at the Saratoga County Fair. His individual successes propelled him to show at several fairs and included trips to the NYS Fair where he had his share of memorable times. In a tribute to his 60 years of showing cattle and his passion to see youngsters involved in showing at the fair, a continuing "Fred Sanders Award" was established to begin with the 2012 Saratoga County Fair.

Fred had a passion for showing cattle and enjoyed watching the local 4-H'ers showing their cattle at the fair. Each year, in his honor, the winner's name will appear on a wall plaque in the Saratoga County Fair Office as well as a \$250 cash award and an individual plaque presented in the show ring to the Saratoga County 4-H'er who garners the highest points total from the following:

10 Points: Awarded to any Saratoga County 4-H'er who participates on Public Presentation Day/ Make-Up Day in March.

<u>5 Points:</u> Awarded to 4-H'ers who participates in a minimum of 5 county dairy bowl practices as either a participant or teen coach.

<u>**5 Points:**</u> Awarded to the 4-H'ers who participates in at least 1 4-H Dairy Cattle Judging event. The Saratoga County Fair judging class does not count.

**<u>2 Points:</u>** Awarded to 4-H'ers who participates in judging class at the Saratoga County Fair

**<u>1 Point:</u>** Will be awarded each time a 4-H'er participates in a 4-H Dairy Club meeting or activity.

<u>5 Points:</u> Awarded to 4-H'ers who create an educational poster or display that falls under Dept. 12-General Animal Science, Section A, Class 6- Posters illustrating an animal science topic in the Saratoga County 4-H Fair Book.

Points Awarded for participation in Fitting and Showmanship at the Saratoga County Fair:

10 Points: Blue Danish Score 7 Points: Red Danish Score 4 Points: White Danish Score

Additionally, points will be awarded for each of the following classes in Dept. 1, Section H of the 4-H Fair Book. Class

1: Best Bred and Owned by exhibitor (all breeds competing together)

3 Points: 1st Place 2 Points: 2nd Place 1 Point: 3rd Place

\*In the event of a tie, a Dairy Challenge exam will be given to break the tie\*

For the 2022 year, the point system will be in effect as of January 1, 2022

Saratoga County 4-H Robovines FTC 6955 showcased their Robotics knowledge and skills at the FTC Qualifier held last weekend at Corning-Painted Post High School. For their efforts, the team made up of youth from across Saratoga County won the Championship, while setting the mark with the top score in NYS this year. The FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC) is broken down in so many ways and the team won the overall game. They were also acknowledged with the top award or the "Inspire Award". They received the 2nd place Motivate, 3rd place Control, and 2nd place Innovate. With this win it qualifies the Robovines for the FTC Regionals at Mohawk Community College on March 6<sup>th</sup>.

The Inspire Award is a judged award given to the team that best embodies the 'challenge' of the FIRST Tech Challenge program. The team that receives this award is a strong ambassador for FIRST programs and a role model FIRST team. This team is a top contender for many other judged awards and is a gracious competitor. The Inspire Award winner is an inspiration to other Teams, acting with Gracious Professionalism both on and off the Playing Field. This team shares their experiences, enthusiasm and knowledge with other teams, sponsors, their community, and the judges. Working as a unit, this team will have shown success in performing the task of designing and building a Robot.

The final part of the day involved two teams making up an alliance to compete together against a second alliance. The grouping paired the Robovines with Mechanical Meltdown, a team of youths from Central NY. The alliance won both the semifinals and finals to win the overall Robot Game. The alliance currently has five out of the top ten scores in New York State.

Many Saratoga County 4-H'ers have been involved and benefited from this great opportunity. To apply, you need to write a one or two page essay. The essay should include: ☐ Why are you interested in the calf? ☐ What are your responsibilities on you farm or farm where you work? ☐ Why do you feel you are worthy of this animal? ☐ How would you develop this calf to her fullest potential? ☐ What other activities and interests do you have?
