25 Bluebird Facts

- 1. The Eastern Bluebird is the New York State Bird
- 2. Bluebirds eat insects. They capture and eat them mostly on the ground, often while the bug is in the larva stage. That's why they are a farmer's favorite bird!
- 3. Bluebirds are territorial. The male Bluebird keeps all other Bluebirds off his territory.
- 4. The male Bluebird finds a nesting cavity in the spring.
- 5. The male attracts the female to a nest site and the female Bluebird builds her first nest during the first two weeks of April.
- 6. When a baby Bluebird leaves the nest, it is called a "fledgling". Fledglings are able to fly about 18 days after they hatch
- 7. When the mother Bluebird builds a second nest, the father Bluebird continues to take care of the young that have fledged.
- 8. Nest sites used to be old wooden fence posts, holes in dead trees or in a hedgerow.
- 9. A Bluebird's nest is made of weeds and grass.
- 10. Larger fields and fewer hedgerows have led to a shortage of nest cavities. This has contributed to shortage of Bluebirds in the East.
- 11. Pesticides poison the insects that the Bluebirds eat.
- 12. Wet, cold springs can be very harmful to the survival of young Bluebirds
- 13. A blowfly (parasite), can harm baby Bluebirds.
- 14. Predators are a problem. Bluebird enemies include raccoons, domestic cats, and snakes.
- 15. Starlings, English Sparrows, and House Wrens compete with Bluebirds for nesting sites and they chase Bluebirds from their homes.
- 16. If you put two nest boxes next to each other, you MAY get a family of Bluebirds in one and a family of Tree Swallows in the other. They will nest next to each other but not next to their own species.
- 17. Bluebirds do not desert their young after people come in contact with them. Be sure you check on your Bluebirds!
- 18. Your Bluebird nest box should be 5-6 feet off the ground.
- 19. Bluebird lay 3-5 pale blue eggs.
- 20. The mother Bluebird incubates her eggs to keep them warm.
- 21. Bluebird eggs hatch in 14-15 days.
- 22. Adult bluebirds may have 2-3 nests per year.
- 23. Bluebird babies are fed insects by their parents
- 24. The bluebird family joins a flock and migrates south during the fall.
- 25. To help Bluebirds, you can build a nest box.
