4-H Robotics and COVID-19 Adapt and Move Forward!

Saratoga County 4-H has continued to run their FIRST robotics program despite COVID. For the last 4 years, Saratoga County 4-H has run a large robotics program. They have had over 100 youth involved every year. They have run a drop-in program that grew into a program using Lego EV3's and OZObots for youth ages 5 to 10 years old. This program ran every Wednesday night and served youth from all over Saratoga County. In addition, there were two FIRST Tech Challenge teams and one FIRST LEGO League team that represented Saratoga County 4-H.

FIRST® inspires young people to be science and technology leaders and innovators by engaging them in exciting mentor-based programs that build science, engineering, and technology skills, that inspire innovation, and that foster well-rounded life capabilities including self-confidence, communication, and leadership.
 In this year of COVID, Saratoga County 4-H was forced to pause the drop-in program due to being unable to safely bring the number of people that come to the program together. The program will resume when it is safe to do so, hopefully in the Fall of 2021.

But the FIRST teams of Saratoga County 4-H have continued to operate. Beginning in August, Saratoga County 4-H and their robotics leaders came up with a protocol that would safely bring the youth involved back together. This protocol has included masks, social distancing and strict cleaning of the area being used. When building a robot, youth wore their masks and worked at long tables to distance as well as possible.

In September, a Saratoga County 4-H team, Robovines virtually hosted the FIRST TECH Challenge kick-off. They had teams and youth from all over New York virtually learn what the new challenge would be. They also set up the field and held a Q & A with all the teams being able to see the field. This was the first time that Saratoga County 4-H started to have youth together and it was very successful.

After Kick-off, both Saratoga County 4-H FTC teams, Robovines and Hazmatrix began to build their robots. They have met on separate nights in the same 4-H building. The protocol has been masks and social distancing. After each meeting, the teams carefully wipe down the tables and common surfaces to prepare for the other team. When COVID numbers increased, Robovines, who has 8 members broke their team down even more and only met with half the team at a time. Both teams have continued to meet safely.

FIRST Tech Challenge(FTC) teams work to build an 18" by 18" robot that runs on a 12' by 12' field. This year all New York State FIRST teams have gone to remote competitions. FIRST has had to pivot the way competitions are run and have provided their teams with a remote platform to compete in. The field has gotten smaller to an 8' by 12' field and instead of 4 robots on the field, there is only 1. Teams are required to score themselves and submit their scores. The second part of FTC is a judging part where teams meet with judges and share what they have accomplished in their season both robot and outreach-wise. This year that platform needed to change as well. Teams meet with judges via Zoom and share what they have done. Both teams will have competitions in March, April and May. Saratoga County 4-H also has a FIRST LEGO LEAGUE (FLL) team that competes every year. This year's team met twice a week to build a robot with a LEGO EV3 and to solve a problem of getting people to be more active which FIRST gave them as a challenge. The B-Spa Beasts came up with an app that would track people's activity and share it with gym teachers while the students continued to be virtual in school. Their robot competes on an 4' by 8' field and has challenges that their robot needs to do autonomously.

"We were greeted at every meeting with youth excited to be able to do something normal" says Saratoga County 4-H Leader Lisa Russell. "The kids were beating us to our meetings because they were anxious to get started." We appreciate that Saratoga County 4-H saw the value to keeping the doors open for our youth and giving them something to be excited about.

Pullorum Testing

Poultry other than doves, pigeons, and waterfowl must be tested annually for pullorum within 90 days of the fair. The walk in clinic at the Saratoga County Fairgrounds will be held on <u>June 29th from 11:00-2:00pm</u> in the Townley building. There is no cost for this required testing.

Alternatively, the poultry owner may present certification that the birds originated directly from a pullorum clean flock. The flock test must have been done within one year of the fair. Owners with large numbers of birds may also request an on-farm flock test rather than transport birds to a walk in clinic. Call (518)321-5002 before May 1st to apply for

4-H Tractor Safety

We are excited to again be offering our spring HOSTA Tractor Safety Program. The Capital District 4-H Tractor Safety event for 2021 will feature a mix of virtual and in-person programming.

Participating youth will learn essential safety skills, gain hands on experience with tractors, skid steers & UTV's, and earn their HOSTA safety certification once they pass the written, skills & tractor driving operation tests

Youth 14 & 15 years old are required to have a NSTMOP certificate when employed on farms & agribusinesses that includes operating equipment.

Youth participants must be at least 14 years old as of May 1.

The cost to participate is \$30 for 4-H members, and \$35 for non-members, which includes the cost of enrollment in 4-H.
