

### Public Presentation Day(s) March 12th and more!

Public Presentations continue to be an invaluable learning experience for our youth. Therefore for 2022 we have reimagined the process again. There are multiple ways listed below. You must register for one of these opportunities by April 1. This will also include Horse Demonstrations.

- 1. March 12th In Person-9am-12pm- This will be set up just like our normal presentations. You will be calling the 4-H office to register your youth. The message must get to a member of the 4-H staff only, and preferably speaking directly to one of us. There will be 3 timeslots every 20 minutes per hour. We will only have 4 rooms set up. Proper PPE protocol will be followed. You will be allowed to unmask while doing your presentation. We will have a staff member there to clean the room in between presentations. Limited space will be available for spectators. Please do not come early. We need to minimize people in the building at any one time. CALL THE 4-H OFFICE TO SIGN UP.
- 2. Zoom Presentations-TBD—Registration will be required. Judges with help from staff will be willing to judge your presentation virtually. You need to know how to be able to use zoom, have a camera on your laptop and be able to speak loudly and clearly for the judges. From there, nothing changes. You'll be judged on the same criteria, given feedback and receive your certificate just like any other year. A staff member will email you the link to sign on. Most people feel comfortable with zoom these days, so we think this may be a good option.
- 3. **Uploaded Presentations: (Only if option 1 or 2 do not work)** You may pre-record your presentation and upload it to our "Box" folder. In addition to uploading your presentation, you will need to email Greg at grs9@cornell.edu to let him know your presentation title and category. ### 4-H Shooting Sports Winter Instructor Workshop February 25th-27th



The 2022 4-H Shooting Sports Winter Instructor Workshop will be held February 25th-27th. This workshop is open to 4-H volunteers. If you are not currently a 4-H volunteer, but would like to become one in order to participate in this training, we can arrange for that as well.

The course will consist of Virtual Positive Youth Development (offered remotely on February 25th) and in-person instruction on February 26-27 at the 4-H Training Center in Ballston Spa. We are limited to 2 participants per discipline this year, so we will have to be selective regarding who is registered, and this does not necessarily mean that it will be "first come first served". Discipline will be given to instructors looking to start a new club in Saratoga county, those who are looking to aid in expanding 4-H Shooting Sports programming in Saratoga County, and those who are currently members of clubs who are looking to expand programming within their club. We hope you understand our need to be selective in registrations. In total, we are only able to send 12 participants from Saratoga County. We are looking at offering a local training for Instructors in the spring for those unable to participate in February.

Disciplines being offered are: Air Pistol, Archery, Hunting, Muzzleloading, Rifle and Shotgun. The cost of the course is \$90 for those not needing lodging, and \$125 for those requiring a hotel room.

### Winter care for 4-H animal projects

As the winter temperatures settle in, make sure you are keeping your 4-H projects healthy. Most animals are well adapted to living outside. However, cold temperatures do require additional animal monitoring. Follow these 4 steps to keep your animals healthy.

- 1. Fresh air—If your animals are housed in a barn make sure there is proper ventilation to prevent the spread of bacteria and viruses.
- 2. Water– whether you provide water from a bucket, tank or automated system, in the cold weather it will freeze. Check the water daily to make sure it is available to your animal in adequate amounts.
  - 3. Feed- Knowing the contents and the quality of the feed you are offering to animals is essential in making sure they have adequate nutrition to meet their energy requirements.

- -The recommended age is 12 and up, however there is a waiting list for 11 year old's.

### What is Horse Bowl?


- ~Horse Quiz Bowl is an opportunity offered as part of the NYS 4-H Equine Program.

### The Fred Sanders Award for 4-H Youth

Fred Sanders grew up showing cattle at the Saratoga County Fair. His individual successes propelled him to show at several fairs and included trips to the NYS Fair where he had his share of memorable times. In a tribute to his 60 years of showing cattle and his passion to see youngsters involved in showing at the fair, a continuing "Fred Sanders Award" was established to begin with the 2012 Saratoga County Fair.

Fred had a passion for showing cattle and enjoyed watching the local 4-H'ers showing their cattle at the fair. Each year, in his honor, the winner's name will appear on a wall plaque in the Saratoga County Fair Office as well as a \$250 cash award and an individual plaque presented in the show ring to the Saratoga County 4-H'er who garners the highest points total from the following:

### **Preferred:**

**<u>5 Points</u>**: Awarded to 4-H'ers who participates in a minimum of 5 county dairy bowl practices as either a participant or teen coach.

**2 Points:** Awarded to 4-H'ers who participates in judging class at the Saratoga County Fair.

10 Points: Awarded to any Saratoga County 4-H'er who participates on Public Presentation Day/Make-Up Day in March.

<u>5 Points:</u> Awarded to 4-H'ers who create an educational poster or display that falls under Dept. 12-General Animal Science, Section A, Class 6- Posters illustrating and animal science topic in the Saratoga County 4-H Fair Book.

### Required:

Points Awarded for participation in Fitting and Showmanship at the Saratoga County Fair:

10 Points: Blue Danish Score 7 Points: Red Danish Score 4 Points: White Danish Score

Additionally, points will be awarded for each of the following classes in Dept. 1, Section H of the 4-H Fair Book.

Class 1: Best Bred and Owned by exhibitor (all breeds competing together)

Class 2: Daughter Dam

Class 3: Exhibitors Herd (all breeds competing together and herd may be split by breeds)

3 Points: 1<sup>st</sup> Place 2 Points: 2<sup>nd</sup> Place 1 Point: 3<sup>rd</sup> Place

\*In the event of a tie, there will be a question asked for the tie breaker.

For the 2022 year, the point system will be in effect as of January 1, 2022
