### **The Veterinary Science Project**

Saratoga County 4-H will be hosting the Vet Science Project Tuesday nights starting February 21st, 2022. Class times are 6-7:30pm. Classes are held at the Training Center and other locations will be sent in a schedule. 4-H youth will learn from Veterinary medical professionals. The recommended age is 12 and up, however there is a waiting list for 11 year old's, first come-first served as space permits.

Horse Bowl is a jeopardy-like horse trivia contest that members practice and compete as teams. Horse Bowl practices will be held at 6:30pm on Tuesday nights starting December 6th. Practices will continue on a weekly basis and all sessions will be held at the Cooperative Extension Office.

Each participant will be placed in a team with members with similar ages and abilities.

### **Team Levels:**

Novice - 13 y/o and under in their first or second year of competition

Junior - 13 y/o and under moving up from Novice

Senior - 14 y/and over.

All ages are calculated as of January 1, 2023

Regional Competitions and State Competitions will be held in the spring. All seniors have the opportunity to compete for a spot at the National Event in Kentucky in November!

# NEW: Participation Contest Saratoga County 4-H Horse



All Saratoga County 4-H Horse members, ages 8-18, are eligible to earn points for participating in horse-related 4-H activities.

Different activities earn different points.

Contest Starts December 1st 2022 and ends October 1st 2023



### PARTICIPATION POINTS

Attendance 1PT: Each time a 4-H Horse member attends Horse bowl practice, a horse club meeting, hippology, or a County Wide Horse Program they will receive one point. Event leaders will be asked to to submit an attendance sheet after meetings and activities. IMPORTANT: Those arriving late or leaving early will not receive an attendance point.

Regional Contest 3PT: For each regional event a 4-H horse member participates in they will receive 3 points. Participation includes competing or volunteering at the event. 4-H Educator Brieanna Hughes will take attendance or assign an adult volunteer to do so. You must participate for the entire event, or at least 4 hours at longer events.

General Participation 2PT: When a 4-H Horse member participates in a general activity including Horse shows, 4-H Tack sales, fundraisers (for any Saratoga County 4-H Fundraiser), or any CCE Equine event they will receive two points. Participation includes competing or volunteering. You must participate for the entire event, or at least 4 hours at longer events.

Horse Communications PT VARIES: Different than the other categories, you must participate in the horse communication category to be eligible for the final prize. Volunteering at the event will not count towards points. At the County level participants will receive 5 points, at the regional level participants receive 15 points, and at the state level 4-H Horse members will receive 50 points!

State Contest 40 PT: Each individual who participates in any state contest will receive 40 points.

Participation includes competing and volunteering at the event. You must participate for the entire event, or at least 4 hours at longer events.

### RULES?

- Participants must be members of Saratoga County 4-H
- Participants MUST be involved in the 4-H Horse program. Including one of the following: be in a horse club, participate in a horse contest, or have a project horse
- Participants must get a point in each of the categories (Attendance, Regional Contest, General participation, 4-H Horse Communications) to qualify for the grand prize.

### Dairy Bowl


Dairy Bowl will be putting teams together and practicing for competitions in the upcoming year. If you are interested in bovine or have dairy knowledge you should sign up!

**Gingerbread House Community Service** 

November is the month many of you will be making gingerbread houses for the Festival of Trees, during the Victorian Street Walk, and for display at the Saratoga The structures have been a great combination of some very unique gingerbread schools, churches, stables, castles, and yes, houses.

A gingerbread house display is a great community service opportunity for 4-H. It enables us to be an active member of a community event as well as being able to share the houses with local groups like the senior center, soup kitchen and nursing homes. The houses are first displayed at various locations at the Victorian Streetwalk, and then donated to local community centers and nursing homes for further display.

Information to help you participate in the gingerbread project:

- All houses need to be brought to the 4-H Office by Monday, November 28th.
- There are two gingerbread kits available to borrow. The kits contain instructions, equipment and supplies. Not quite everything you will need, but the hard to find items are there. Clubs can borrow the kits for one week. Call the 4-H Office at 518-885-8995 to reserve the kit.
- IF your club is making a scene with multiple houses or other structures the board you place it on cannot be larger than 2' by 2'.
- IF your club is making individual houses or structures please place them on a sturdy base such as wood, foam board, or heavy cardboard. Please do not use a single piece of cardboard.
- Houses will be at multiple locations. We are still solidifying those locations. If your club is interested in staffing one of the locations please call the 4-H Office.


